#### BOARD HIRES DALE MEEK AS NEW POLICE CHIEF

The Town Board took great care in selecting a Police Chief for Center. After a careful look at applications, interviews with selected candidates, and a Meet and Greet with the community, the Board selected Dale Eugene Meek as our new Police Chief.

Mr. Meek has 25 years of law enforcement experience with degrees in Criminal Justice and Homeland Security. He has expertise in gang investigations, intelligence based policing, teaching and training officers, mental health issues in policing, and several other areas of law enforcement.

Currently from Santa Fe, Mr. Meek is looking for a small town to settle in. He will be a working chief, committed to building a good police department and protecting the community in a fair manner. He will begin his duties on August 12, 2019.

## INVESTIGATIONS OF RECENT CRIMES ONGOING

Unfortunately, there have been several crimes committed in Center recently, including burglary and trespassing.

We want to assure the public that these crimes are under investigation. Our police department is working with other law enforcement agencies to resolve these crimes.

Anyone with information related to any crimes in our town is encouraged to contact the police, the Town Manager, or any member of the Town Board so the crimes can be solved.

## BOARD SIGNS WITH DOWNTOWN COLORADO, INC.

The Town Board agreed to sign a Memorandum of Agreement with Downtown Colorado, Inc. to work on assessing our downtown and commercial areas and to create a plan for enhancing Downtown Center. The agreement will include meeting with a team of trainers and other professionals to help develop strategies for economic development.

A focus on youth engagement will be part of the project with consultants providing training for potential upcoming entrepreneurs. Kids can then enter a mini-business-plan competition. The project will also work with the Town to create messaging on social media, print media, and flyers to promote our town as a business-friendly community. The Town has received \$10,000 in grants from the Colorado Department of Local Affairs and the Saguache County Commissioners to pay for this effort.

Working hard to lay new underground electric lines to replace our outdated lines,
Center's Utility crew have finished laying primary lines down Miles and Warden Streets
