CENTER'S WATER USAGE IMPROVES NOTABLY

Check out the numbers for the amount of water we have used so far in 2021. As of July 31, we have used 99,384,685 gallons of water compared to 130,335,327 gallons of water used last year at this time. That is nearly 31 million gallons less. Good for us! We can do this!

The water meter billing system is still being worked on. It has been a difficult process but we're getting there. Thanks for your patience

SPEED LIMIT WILL BE LOWERED IN CENTER

Did you know that the current speed limit in Center is 30 mph in the residential areas? The Town Board and many citizens feel that we need to reduce the speed here in town. The Board will be acting on an ordinance to reduce the speed limit to 25 mph in all residential areas unless otherwise marked. This will be considered at the September 14 meeting.

REMINDERS

Please post your house number. All residences in Center MUST have house numbers posted. This is necessary so services such as ambulance, fire, and other services can reach your home if needed. The water meter project has been hindered by lack of house numbers. Citations (\$50) will be given for non-compliance.

Retrieve yard sale signs. If you are having a yard sale and have posted signs throughout the town, please remember to remove those signs after your yard sale is over. Let's keep our town looking neat.

Please remove weeds. Weeds are still lurking about many properties. You are responsible for removing weeds on your property including your alley and the town right-ofway in front of your home.
